If you are a teenager and are seriously considering an early marriage, these are a number of potential problem areas of which you should be aware, so that, if you do decide that this is the best course of action, you will be alert to the possible difficulties, which could lie ahead. The start of the American period made Philippine poetry in English possible. In 1900, English became the official medium of instruction in Philippine schools.
